## I. THE PERSON(S) TO WHOM THIS PRESCRIPTION IS GIVEN (5:14-15)

- A. The Candidate(s) Are Described Both Physically And Spiritually
  - 1. Spiritually: A Believer
  - 2. Physically: Seriously Sick (5:14-15)
    - a. Two Different Words In The Respective Verses
    - b. The Elder(s) Must Go To The Person
    - c. The Promise Of Being "Raised Up" Suggests The Person Is Bed Ridden Or Significantly Incapacitated
- B. The Candidate(s) Are To Undergo An Exacting Procedure
  - 1. Call For The Elder(s)
    - a. Not Faith Healers
    - b. Men Whose Character Is Above Reproach
  - 2. Anointing With Oil (5:14)
    - a. Medicinal Or Symbolic?
      - 1. Ministered By Elders, Not Doctors
      - 2. Anointed Not Massaged
      - 3. Same Prescription For Every Kind Of Malady
      - 4. Used In Conjunction With Miraculous Healings
    - b. Done In The Name Of The Lord
  - 3. Praying (5:15)

## II. THE PROMISES THAT ACCOMPANY OR FOLLOW THE PRESCRIPTION (5:15)

- A. The Candidate Will Be Saved Physically
  - 1. Not A Case Of Praying On A Whim
  - 2. Context Indicates A Conviction On The Part Of The Sick Of God's Ability And Willingness To Heal
  - 3. Nevertheless, Is This A Guarantee Of 100% Success?
    - a. Historical & Scriptural Instances Of Lack Of Success
    - b. There Are Exceptions To the Rule
    - c. No Believer Would Ever Die
- B. Sins Will Be Forgiven
