- B. John's Is The Only Account That Has Reference To The Fact That At Least Two Groups Of Boats Had Come Out To Find Jesus

 - 1. Matthew & Mark Say He Had Been On Land Praying
 - 2. Mark Says He "Saw Them" While He Was On The Land
 - 3. John Echoes Some Pertinent Comments
 - a. When The Lord Approached These Men On The Water They Became Even More Terrified Than They Already Were (6:19)
 - b. In Audible Words, The Lord Commanded Them To Stop Being Afraid (6:20)
 - c. He More Than Delivered Them From The Physical Peril (6:21)
