- I. THE LORD WAS CONSUMED WITH PRAYER THROUGHOUT THE DAYS OF HIS FLESH
 - A. The Gospels Record Many Instances Which Afford Us Glimpses Into His Prayer Life
 - B. But This Is The Only Occasion In Any Of The Gospels Where The Lord's Prayer Was Heard, In Its Entirety, By The Apostles
- II. THE TONE OR ATMOSPHERE OF THIS PARTICULAR PRAYER LEADS US INSTINCTIVELY INTO A MIND SET OF WORSHIP
 - A. The Opening Reference To The Lord's Initial Gesture Puts Us Immediately In That Arena (17:1)
 - B. The Lord So Naturally Transitioned From Addressing Men To Addressing The Father
 - 1. There Are Two Terms Used In The N.T. To Convey The Idea Of Making Request
 - 2. The Lord's "I Pray" Bespeaks One Dignity Addressing Another
 - C. The Atmosphere Of This Prayer Was Surely Different From That Which Would Prevail At Gethsemane
