- I. THE PSALMIST ASKS A RHETORICAL QUESTION THAT ASSUMES THE ACCEPTANCE OF AN UNSTATED ANSWER (139:7)**
  
- II. JUST IN CASE THERE IS ANY DOUBT, THE PSALMIST EXPLORES WHAT MAY SEEM TO DESPERATE EYES TO BE POSSIBLE ESCAPE ROUTES (139:8-12)**
  - A. There Is No Place High Enough Or Low Enough To Escape The Presence Of God (139:8)**
  
  - B. There Is No Place Long Enough Or Wide Enough To Escape The Presence Of God (139:9-10)**
  
  - C. There Is No Place Dark Enough To Hide A Man From The Presence Of God (139:11-12)**
    - 1. Even If A Man Were Able To Literally Completely Wrap Himself In Complete Darkness, Even that Would Become As A Flashlight To God (139:11)**
  
    - 2. To God, The Night Is As Bright As The Day (139:12)**
